SCIS was created with the aim of providing schools with access to a database of consistent catalogue records created according to agreed national standards, in order to reduce the cost and duplication of effort of cataloging resources in schools. Since its inception, SCIS has been responsible for improving the quality and consistency of cataloging materials for schools.

SCIS is a business unit of Education Services Australia, a new national, not-for-profit company established by all Australian Ministers of Education. Education Services Australia has been established through the merger of Curriculum Corporation and Education.au Limited. Education Services Australia delivers innovative, cost-effective services across all sectors of education.

SCIS continues to support school libraries throughout Australia and New Zealand, offering access to the largest database of school-related catalogue records in the Southern Hemisphere. It also maintains SCIS Subject Headings, a controlled list of subject headings particularly appropriate to the needs of schools; SCIS Authority Files, a downloadable file of all approved SCIS Subject and Name Headings, which can be imported directly into schools' library management systems; and SCIS Special Order Files, which allow schools to download regularly updated bulk files of catalogue records for educational websites, ClickView video files and The Learning Federation (TLF) learning objects.

Head of Professional Learning: Syba Academy

In 2014 Lyn Hay officially joins the Syba Academy team as the Head of Professional Learning. Lyn has written a number of journal articles, book chapters and papers, and has presented at numerous conferences both nationally and internationally. After 20 years teaching across K-12, TAFE and tertiary sectors in South Australia, Victoria and Western Australia Pru moved into a national education support role, working for eight years as part of the Education Network Australia (edna) team.

Her current role is with Schools Catalogue Information Service (SCIS) which is a part of the newly formed not-for-profit Education Services Australia (formerly Education.au and Curriculum Corporation) where she is the Subscriber Support Coordinator.

Throughout her career Pru has been involved in developing and presenting professional learning for educators and is a teacher librarian with a long history working with online technologies in schools. She has undertaken national research projects in professional standards, professional learning, e-learning and e-assessment.

Pru's qualifications include Graduate Certificate in School Management (CQU), Masters of Education (CSU), Graduate Diploma in Library & Information Science (CSU), Diploma of Teaching (ECE) (SACAE).

Pru has been active in many professional associations over her career including a term as national Vice-President (Association Relations) for the Australian School Library Association and several terms as conference convenor.

She is currently Vice-President (Professional Learning) of the School Library Association of South Australia and CEASA Committee Member.
