Digital Citizenship Online Extension Course

A facilitator-led, four-week online extension course

Facilitated by Lyn Hay, Head of Professional Learning: Syba Academy

This course is designed to provide teachers, teacher-librarians, curriculum and e-learning coordinators with an opportunity to develop digital citizenship policy and programs to address the specific needs of their school community. The knowledge, skills and behaviours that people of all ages as digital citizens need to develop, understand and practice are explored using Ribble's (2011) nine elements of digital citizenship. These include: digital access, digital commerce, digital communication, digital literacy, digital etiquette, digital law, digital rights and responsibilities, digital health and wellness, and digital security.

Upon completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Define digital citizenship and identify a range of digital citizenship issues;
- Evaluate digital technologies and social networking tools to support the teaching of digital citizenship in their school;
- Develop a community awareness program to support discussions about digital citizenship issues in their school with students, teachers and parents;
- Model digital citizenship skills to teachers, students, and parents; and
- Develop a matrix of relevant Australian Curriculum content and skills to underpin a school-based digital citizenship program.

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Introducing the Syba Academy

Digital citizenship

Digital citizenship involves an understanding of the human, cultural, and societal issues related to safe, effective and ethical use of technologies in our personal and working lives. Schools need to develop a digital citizenship program that encourages students, teachers and parents to advocate and practice safe, legal, and responsible use of information and technology; to exhibit a positive attitude toward using technology that supports collaboration, learning, and productivity; to demonstrate personal responsibility for digital well-being and lifelong learning; and to exhibit leadership for digital citizenship.

About this course

The course is held over a period of four weeks, with participants completing on average five hours per week of course work. The course syllabus consists of six modules:

1. What is digital citizenship?
2. Digital citizenship in schools: Issues and challenges
3. Digital citizenship and the Australian Curriculum
4. Digital citizenship and tech tools
5. Developing a digital citizenship program
6. Leading digital citizenship policy and practice in your school

A maximum of 30 participants are enrolled in this course at a time to ensure participants gain individual instruction and feedback throughout the course.

Participants will complete a range of learning activities and school-based initiatives, engage in online professional discussions with the instructor and course participants, and document the outcomes of their learning according to the NSWIT / AITSL professional teaching standards. Upon completion of the coursework and learning activities, participants are given a further two weeks to complete and submit their documentation for assessment.

Successful completion of this course allows participants to receive endorsed credit for a total of 30 hours of accredited professional learning to NSW and Australian Professional Standards for Teachers at Professional Competence/ Proficient Teacher Level.
