Introduction and Housekeeping

9.15 - 10.30am

Content Curation: Principles & Practice

This session provides an overview of theory, research and practice of content curation. It highlights those aspects of curation where TLs and teachers add intellectual and instructional value to the collection of curated resources. Participants are introduced to a suite of content curation technologies including websites, tools and apps. A range of practical examples of curated collections are used to model effective curation processes and practices.

Curating topics for the Australian Curriculum: Finding your niche

This session will present ways in which curation sites are being used by TLs and teachers to develop customised portals of digital resources to support the Australian Curriculum. Participants will then be expected to identify two topics from learning areas/grade levels of the Australian Curriculum that require resourcing in their school.

11.30am - 12.30pm

Curation tools: Account creation, features and settings

This is a hands on session where participants are provided with step-by-step guidance in creating and managing curation accounts. Participants are also required to articulate a rationale for the selection of those curation tool(s) they intend to use to curate digital collections for their school, based on the specific needs of their school community and the features and functionality of the selected tools.

Go Curate! Building your Collection

This is a hands-on session where participants begin to build digital collections for two Australian Curriculum topics. Participants are provided with individualised instruction while undertaking the curation process.

Participants' curated collections on Australian Curriculum topics as 'works in progress' are shared and viewed by others.

3.15 - 3.30pm

Lessons Learned: Evaluating the Curation Process

Participants evaluate their curation experience and contribute to a collective list of ideas and advice for future curation tasks.
